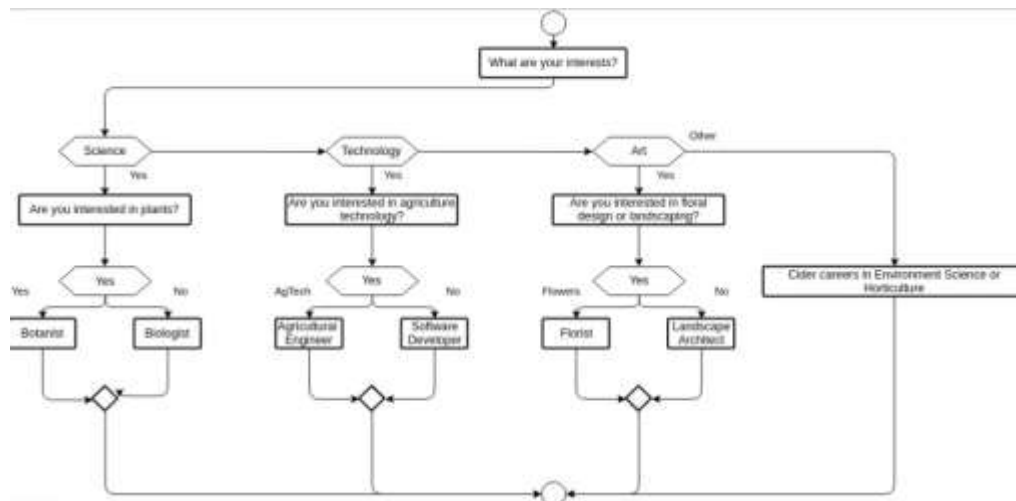


Figure 1: Flow Diagram

SYSTEM ARCHITECTURE

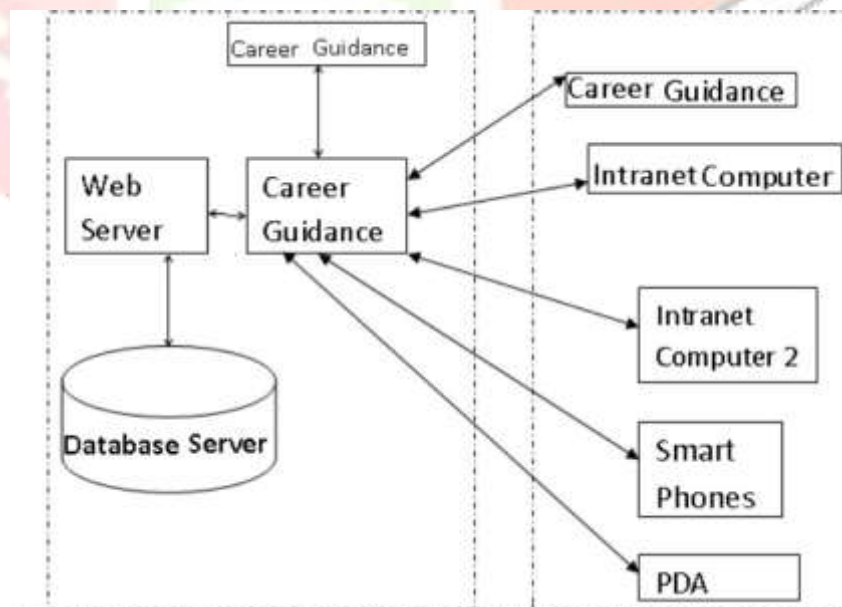


Figure 2: System Architecture Diagram

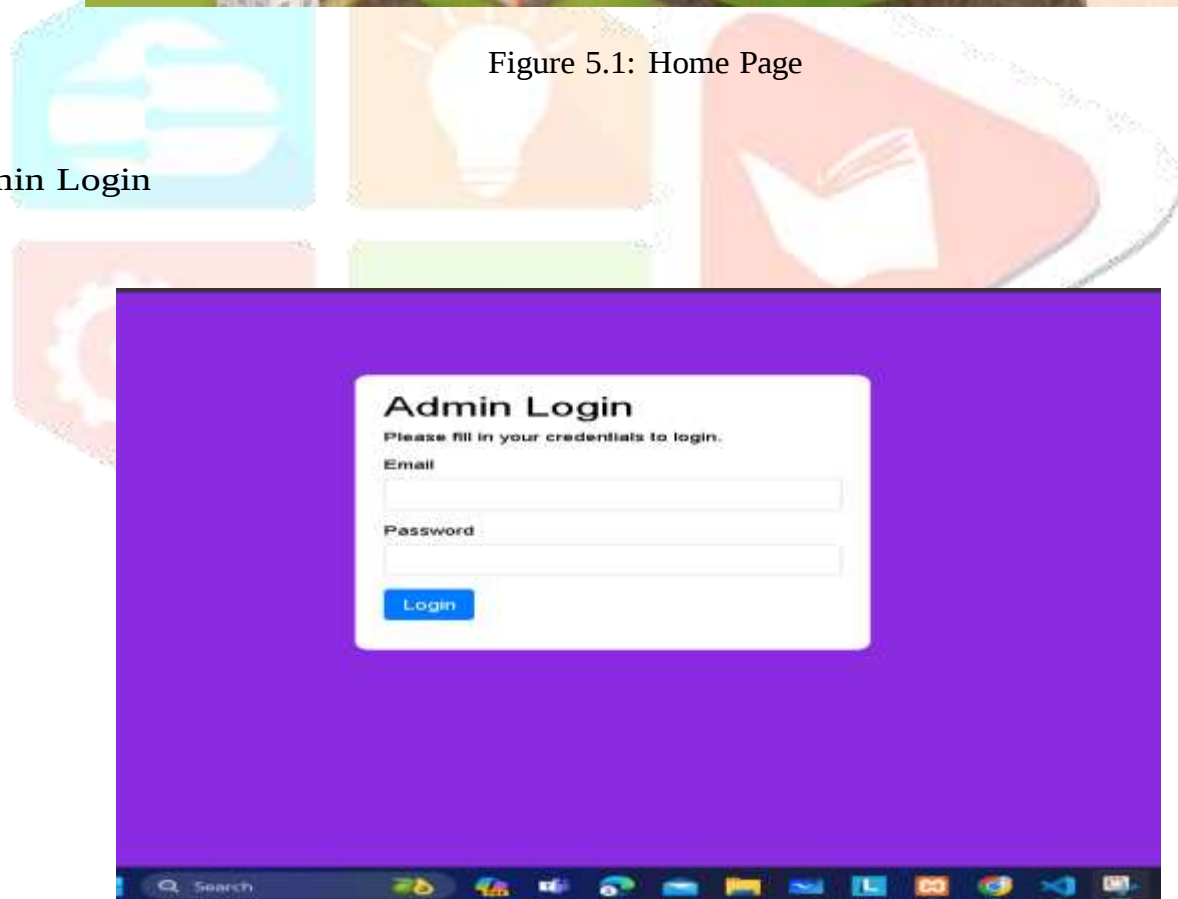


Figure 5.2: Admin Login

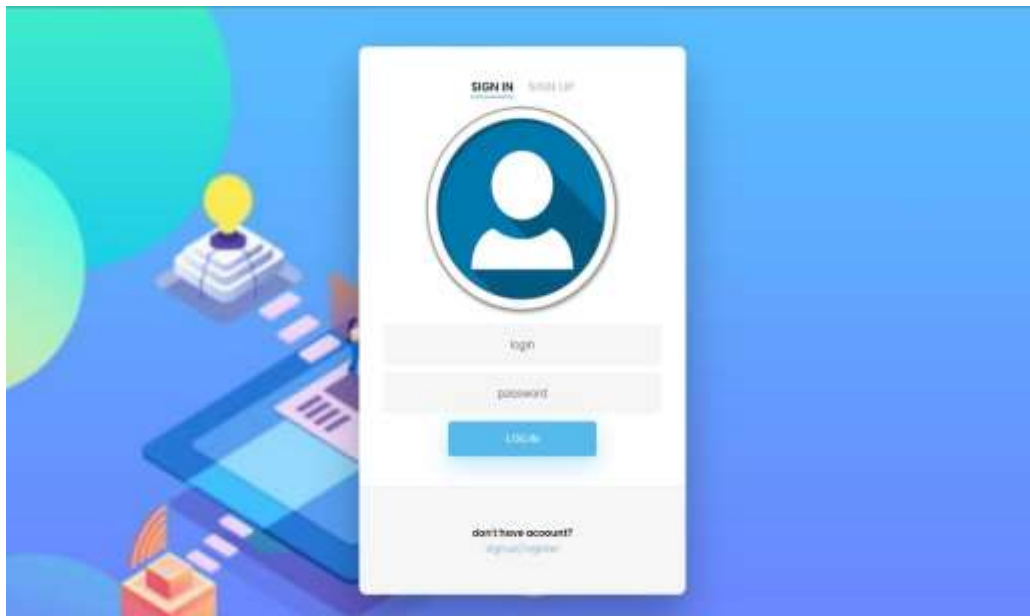
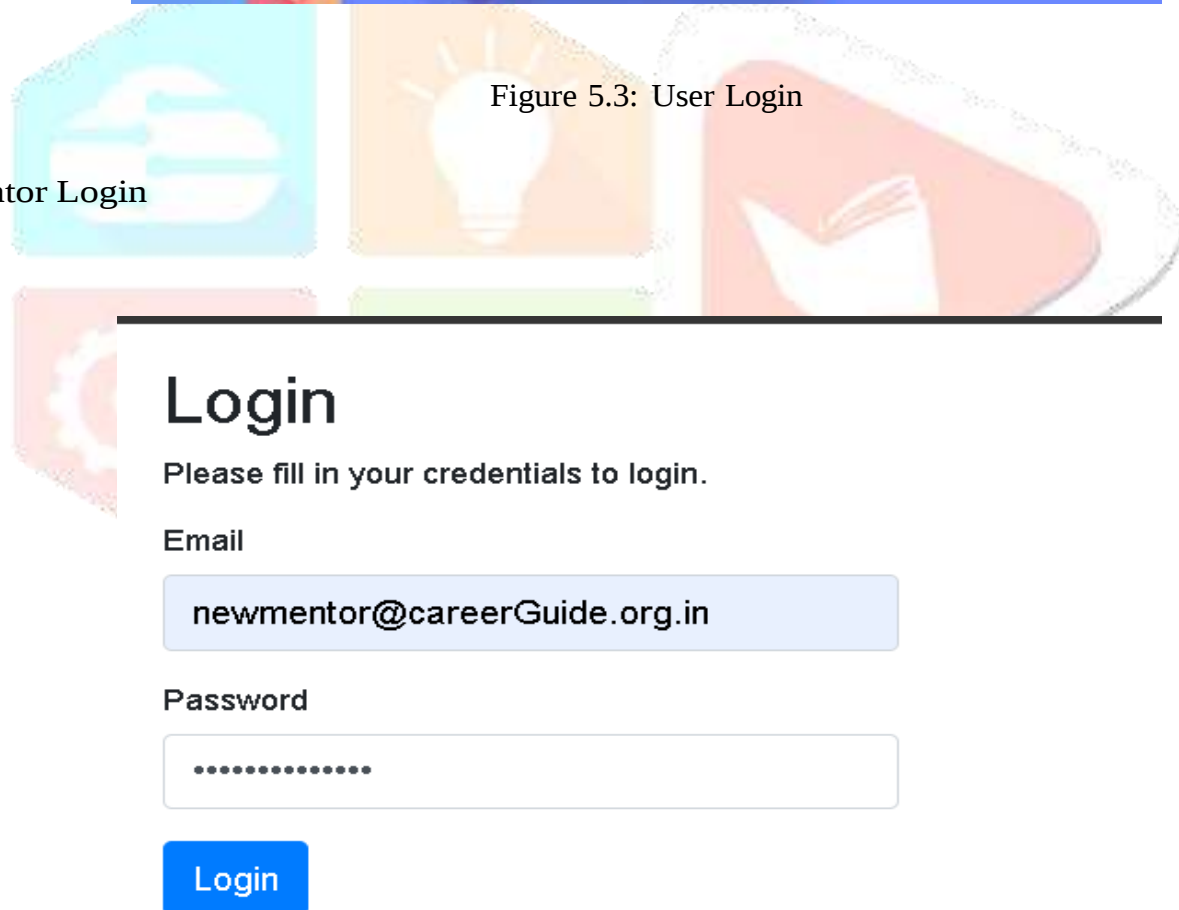


Figure 5.3: User Login

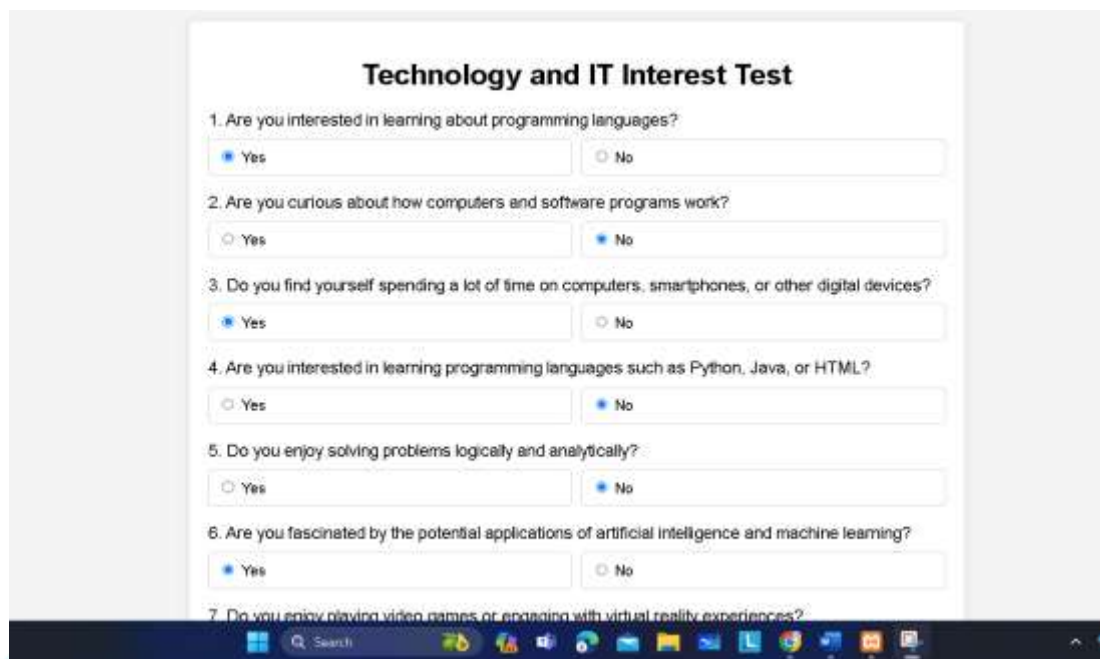

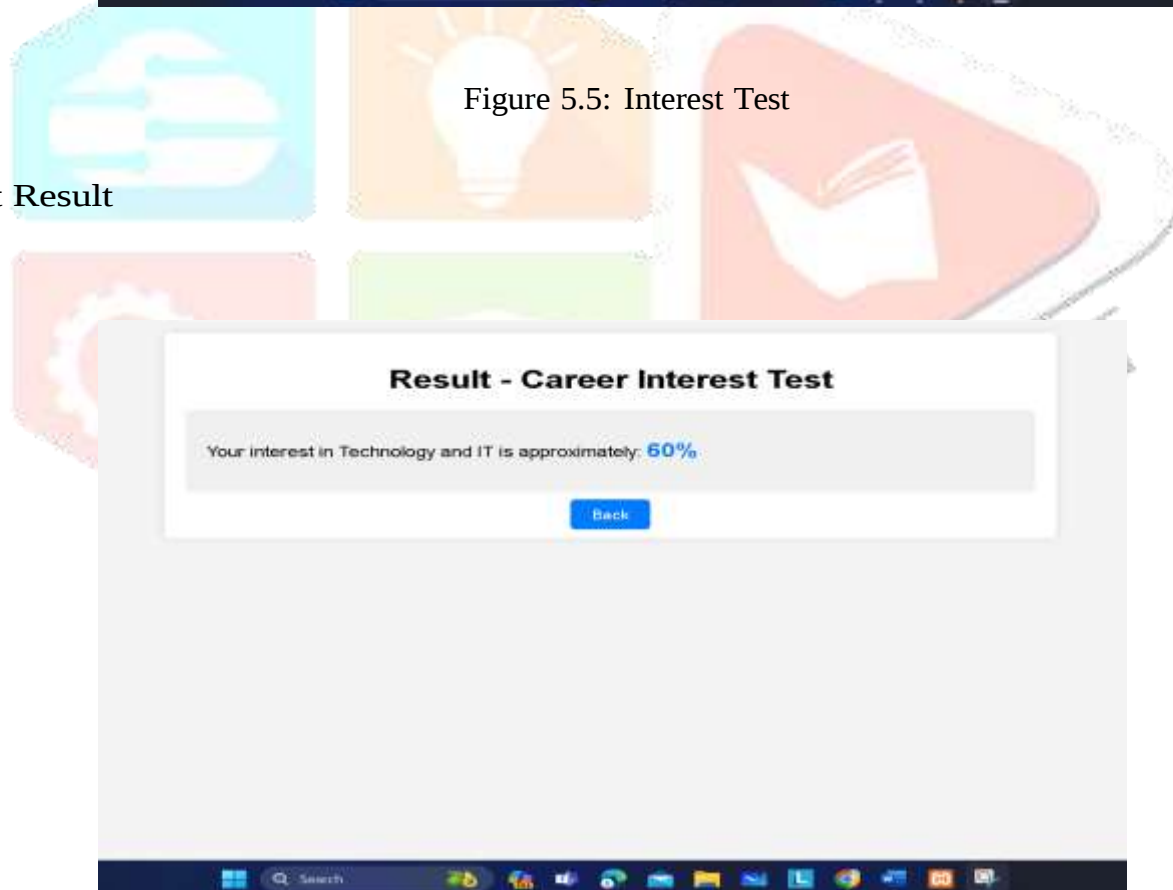
